History

- In 1971, the Winnebago and Wapsipinicon Councils of the Boy Scouts of America combined to become the Winnebago Council. The new council served more than **12,000** Scouts in northeast Iowa. As a result of the merger, the council owned two Scout camps – Winnebago Scout Reservation, near Marble Rock, and Camp Ingawanis, near Waverly.
- Today, the council serves approximately **3,800** boys and still maintains two camps.

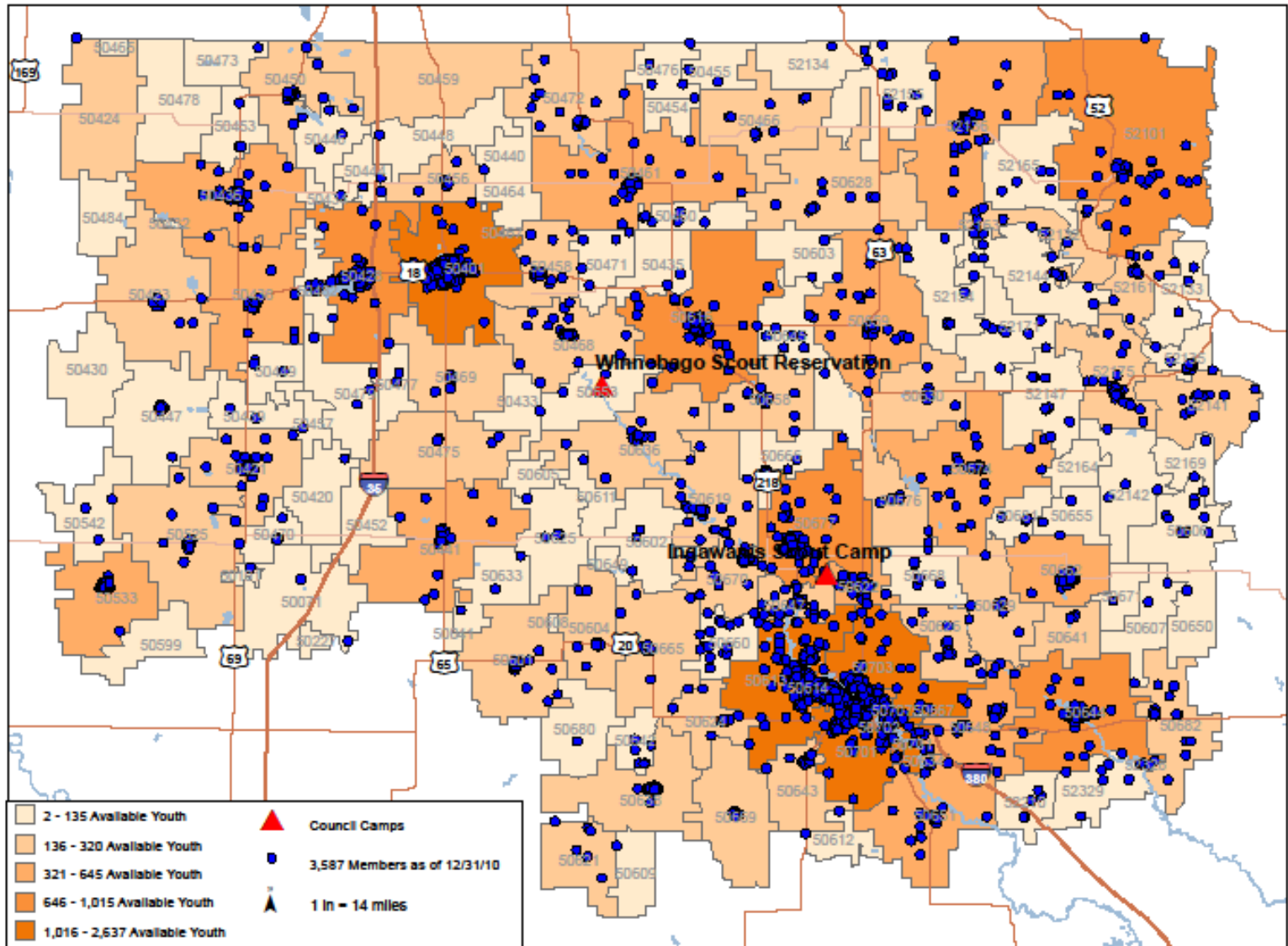

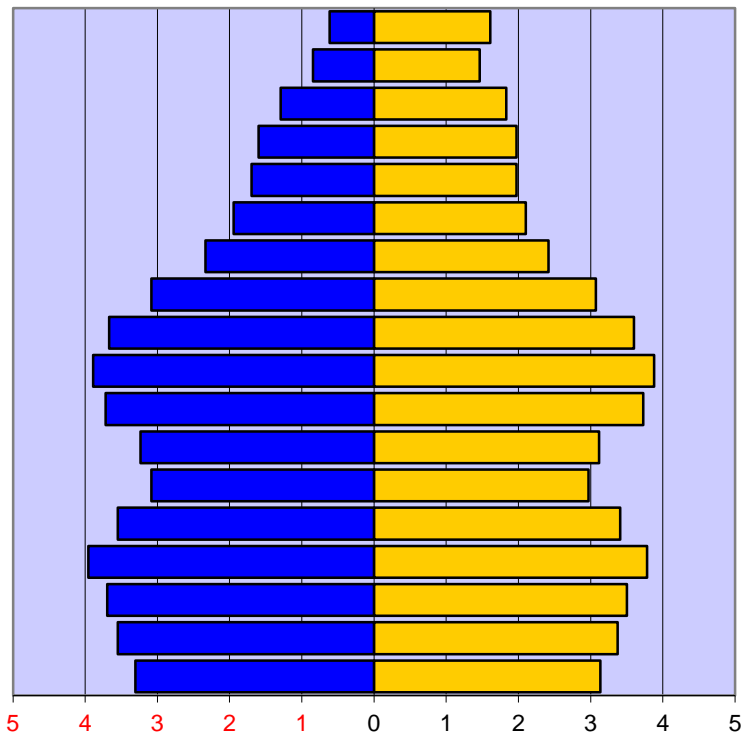

Population Pyramids of Iowa

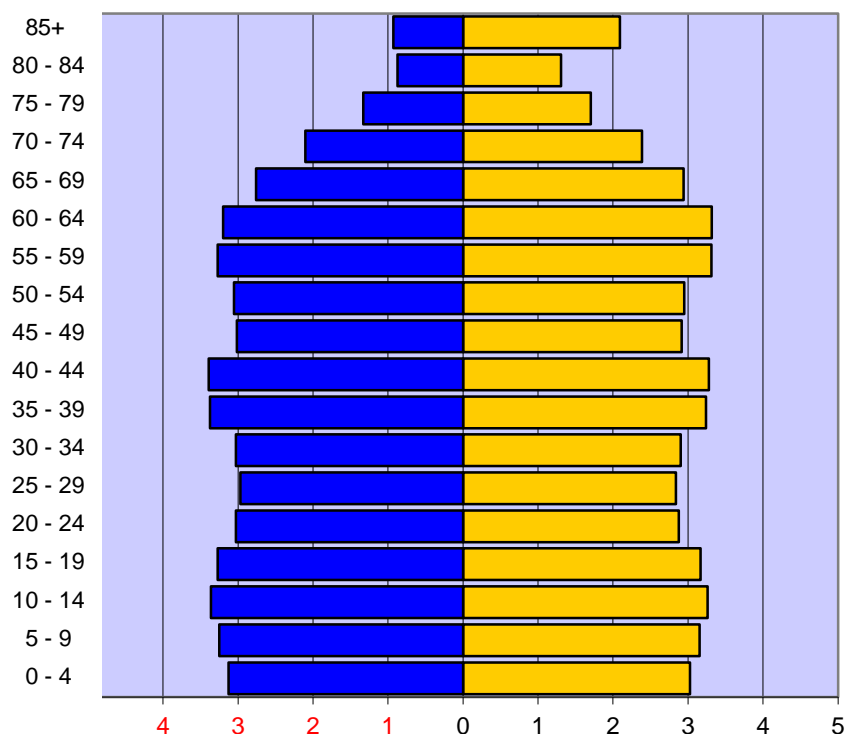
Percent of Total Population

Iowa changes 2005-2025

- Ages 0-4 declining: 182,000 to 175,000 by 2025
- Ages 5-17 declining: 509,000 to 492,000
- Hispanic and Black populations will grow about 150%
- About 4% of population is foreign-born (2009)
- About 4% speak Spanish at home; another 1% speak an Asian/Pacific Islander language (2009)
- 38% of families are headed by female with children under 18 and below the poverty level (2009)
