LNT Master Educator Course

This training will cover both front-country and back-country skills. The course will be held at the Bighorn National Forest Work Center near Burgess Junction, WY and includes a 3-night trek in the Big Horn Mountains. Participants will learn to teach the ethical principles and skills of Leave No Trace while they participate in high adventure activities including:

- Backpacking
- Leave No Trace Camping
- Wilderness Orienteering
- Wilderness Cooking
- Conservation Service Project

Registration is from 8:00AM-9:00AM on Sunday, August 12th at the Bighorn National Forest Work Center. Participants are welcome to arrive on Saturday evening and spend the night. All lodging will be in tents. A recommended gear list and map of the area will be sent with your registration confirmation.

The course fee of \$285 includes all materials, food, lodging, and a course T-shirt. No transportation is included. The nearest airports are in Casper, WY or Billings, MT.

The Bighorn National Forest Burgess Junction Work Center is located 2 miles north of US Highway 14 approximately 27 miles west of Dayton, WY on Forest Service Road 15.
