Dear Unit Leaders,

We are excited to invite your Scout troop to the Wabuha Fall Camporee to be held the weekend of October 1-3 at Ingawanis Adventure Base. Please read through this information thoroughly and share with the leaders, parents and Scouts in your unit.

Saturday morning we will begin the day with a service project. So please dress accordingly. Work gloves may be helpful.

Saturday afternoon activities will include paintball target shooting, archery, rifle shooting, tomahawk throw, mini horse trail rides, Molkky, kayak demonstrations and more.

Especially for the Webelos we will have how to/hands on stations. They will include fire-building, knots, First Aid and Flag Folding.

The Scout Challenge, Be Prepared-Expect the Unexpected is a challenging and competitive scout skill course that will test your scout's basic skills, but also how your troop's team stacks up with other troops who participate. This course is designed for older Scouts, 14 and above and First Class Rank. Teams are limited to no less than two and no more than 3 per team, and only one team per troop. There will be an eight-team limit for the two courses, first come first served. Please note that this will be a new course with new challenges.

We will also have a **Camp Gadget Contest**. See First Class rank requirement 7B. We are encouraging Scouts of all ranks to participate. The gadget must be made at Ingawanis Adventure Base during the camporee. Gadgets will be judged on creativity, lashings, and use of natural materials. Prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd Place.

We need your assistance with staffing this event. With many exciting activities planned for the Troops we need Staff Members! Each Troop is asked to encourage adult leaders to volunteer to work on the Camporee Staff. We are also recruiting BSA certified lifeguards to assist with the Crowdaddy's Kayak Demonstrations.

If there are any adults who would like to assist with the planning and staffing for future Camporees, you can contact us, as fresh ideas are always welcome for these events.

## Camporee Guidelines

**Code of Conduct:** The Scout Oath, The Scout Law, and the Outdoor Code will serve as the code of conduct for the camporee.

**Dress Code:** The Scout uniform will be the uniform of the day. Field uniform (also referenced as Class A's) for Saturday evening flag ceremony, Scout t-shirts for activities and work clothes for the service project.

**Rain or Shine:** All activities will go on as scheduled. Make sure boys are "Prepared" for whatever conditions.

**Adult Leadership:** All units/Scouts participating in the Camporee must at all time be under supervision of 2 adult leaders. One must be 21 years old and the other must be at least 18 years old. Please refer to the Guide to Safe Scouting.

**Camping:** Boy Scout troops may camp on Friday and Saturday evening. All units must provide their own camping gear, food, water, firewood and any other items they may need.

**Webelos Camping:** Webelos may camp with a sponsoring Boy Scout troop and must register with the sponsoring Boy Scout troop. Each Webelos Scout must camp with a parent or guardian (Guide to Safe Scouting, p.19). Please note that per the Guide to Safe Scouting Webelos cannot participate in Paintball target shooting, Rifle Shooting, horse trail rides, or tomahawk throwing.

**Camp Sites:** Campsites will be assigned using 2 criteria. First come first served first paid and number of people camping and the campsite capacity. If you would like the campsite for the sole use of your unit please make a note on the registration form.

**Campsite Availability/Capacity:** Birch Knoll 30, Black Hawk 18, Cedar View 22, Chief Ona 22, Dan Beard 20, Echo Point 60, East Pioneer 24, Ingachook 32, Newakwa 30, Prairie View 32, Ranger 36, Robin Hood 18, Saluyee 30, Sioux Ridge 30, Valley Forge 24, Wakosha 12, Wild Cat Ridge 20.

**Parking:** Each unit may pull their troop trailer with their own vehicle. Once your trailer is unhooked, please move your vehicle to the parking lot. No vehicles will be allowed at campsites unless the leader has secured a medical permission slip.

**Speed Limit in Camp: 10 miles per hour**

**Health & Safety Requirements:** All adults and Scouts are required to have a BSA Health Form with their unit while at the Camporee.

**First Aid:** First Aid will be available at the First Aid Lodge. However, each Troop should be able to take care of minor injuries.

**Garbage Disposal:** Each unit is asked to remove their own garbage. Thank you.

**Pre-Registration:** It is essential for all units to pre-register so that the Camporee committee has an idea of how many to plan for. The cost for pre-registered Scouts will be \$8. **September 17th is the registration deadline.** Fees after this date are \$10 per Scout.

**Interfaith Worship Service:** There will be an interfaith Worship service on Saturday night from 7 to 7:30 pm at the chapel.

**Troop Skits/ Stories Songs:** Please come prepared to perform a skit at the Saturday night campfire.
